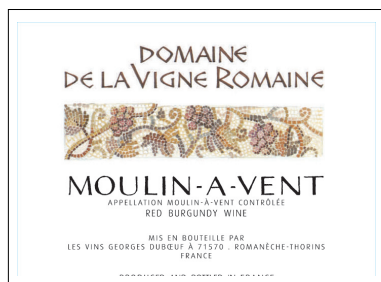

**Georges Dubœuf 2010 Fleurie  
La Madone**

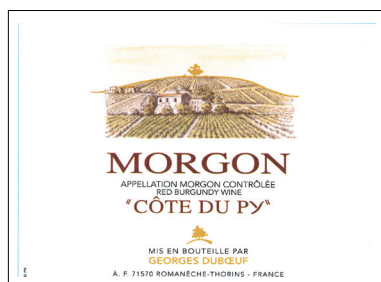
The Dubœuf 2010 Fleurie La Madone displays abundant tart blackberry and cassis tinged with brown spices and pungent herbs on a juicy, if slightly chewy, palate. Here is another of Dubœuf's 2010 Fleuries that reveals considerable structure; promise of at least 3-4 years' interest; and excellent value, rendering it understandable that no wines of this appellation had yet been bottled as of mid-June.

**Georges Dubœuf 2010 Moulin-à-Vent  
Domaine de la Vigne Romaine**

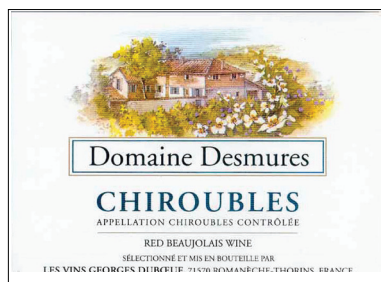
From a property new to the Dubœuf line-up, this wine offers scents and flavors of sour cherry and black raspberry. A seedy sense of invigorating tartness and bitterness as well as a firm palate feel emerge in a finish that I suspect is suffering more from the effects of its recent bottling than from wood-induced drying.



**88+** POINTS

**Georges Dubœuf 2010 Morgon  
Côte du Py**

Leads with scents of buddleia and dark cherry, then offers generous fruitiness along with the beginnings of carnal savor and a peat-like smokiness on the palate. Unfortunately, there is a bit of textural roughness to an otherwise impressively persistent finish; but that may diminish as this puts some distance between itself and its bottling date.



**88** POINTS

**Georges Dubœuf 2010 Chiroubles  
Domaine Desmures**

Said to reflect an especially high percentage of old vines – features tart red raspberry and red currant, a sage-like herbal pungency seemingly pointing to some reduction, but a sense of herbal, black tea, and rose hip infusion ultimately adding interest to a soothingly silken, yet bright, as well as satisfyingly persistent finish.
